Rugby Skills


Y3 enjoyed the spell of good weather this week while out practising tag rugby skills in the sunshine as part of their P.E lesson.

Year 5's first Tag Rugby session!







Our whole school reporting attendance for the week (4th - 11th Sept) is 93.7%. However, our winning classes this week are: FS1, Year 5 and Year 6 with over 96 % and get an extra 10 minute play time. 100



FS1 are our class winners with an amazing 98.8%! They have an extra break and can also choose an extra 10 minute attendance treat... **WOW! WELL DONE!**

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Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing!

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for term time leave taken and irregular attendance.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued (after 19th August) for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance this will be considered the first offence, and the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

5 consecutive days of term time leave

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. Where there is 4 days of absence during a week where there is also a training day, a penalty notice may still be issued.

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty Notice Fines can also be considered when there have been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.

Second Offence

(within 3 years)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate.



Healthy Teeth

Year 4 have been learning all about teeth and how to keep them healthy. We conducted an investigation with egg shells and we have predicted which liquid will cause the most decay.

We have also been testing different types of toothpaste and discussing how we can protect our enamel. All of the children had great enthusiasm for this topic and asked some amazing questions.
