

It's been a busy few weeks in Year 6

We had a fantastic trip to the Yorkshire Wildlife Park where we enjoyed a workshop all about evolution and adaptation to link in with our science unit.

In science, we carried out an experiment to extract DNA from strawberries and in Maths we have looked at different volumes of shapes and used multilink to model how different shapes could have the same volume.


First, we compared our feet to see if the taller person always had larger feet. We looked carefully at each person's feet, measured them, and saw that sometimes the taller person did have bigger feet, but not always! It was a fun way to learn that everyone's body is different.

Next, we tested which parts of our skin are the most sensitive. We gently touched different parts of our bodies like our fingers, elbows, and cheeks and noticed how some places felt more ticklish or sensitive than others. We even used soft objects like feathers and cotton balls to see which part of our skin could feel the lightest touch!

It was a super fun day of learning, and we can't wait to try more experiments in class! Stay tuned for more science adventures from Year 1!
