Year 5 Why do we have day and night?

In science, Y5 have been answering the question "Why do we have day and night?".

We learnt that even though it looks like the Sun is rising and falling in the sky, it is actually the Earth's rotation that causes day and night.

The children used a tennis ball and a torch to reenact the movements of the Earth and we thought carefully about how the Earth's position would be different at sunrise, midday, sunset and midnight. The children are now writing a voiceover for a BBC video clip explaining what they have learnt and they will perform it to each other in lesson.

Great learning, Y5! Well done!


Year 6 MUSIC INSPIRED BY VIVALDI
